**Description:** This SOG will define the rules and regulations for LPEMS Members and establish standards and operational classifications for all member categories.

**Purpose:** The purpose of this SOG is to establish a process that all Lower Providence EMS members understand and acknowledge regarding credentialing, licensure, and certification required and recommended to maintain current operational status.

# **Responsibilities:**

- 1. It shall be the responsibility of the LPEMS Training Coordinator to maintain and provide a current schedule for LPEMS sponsored training and continuing education courses.
  - a. The Training Coordinator is also responsible for maintaining electronic files in the ESO system of all required certifications as outlined in this SOG.
- 2. The member is responsible for attending any continuing education courses and/or training pertinent to maintenance of their certification and/or any classes deemed "Mandatory" to remain operationally current.
- 3. It shall be the responsibility of the member to copy all new and updated certificates and/or certifications via hard copy or electronic copy to the Training Coordinator.
- 4. It is the responsibility of the members to comply with all policies, guidelines, and regulations regarding certification requirements and training attendance.
- 5. Courses offered at LPEMS will typically be offered Free of charge, any charge for a course will be communicated and posted with initial course posting. Full-time and Permanent Part-Time members may be eligible for reimbursement in some cases.
- 6. The member has the ultimate responsibility to maintain the minimum standard of certification required to perform the duties within the scope of their position at LPEMS.
  - a. Failure to maintain an operationally current states may result in separation from the organization.

**Procedure:** All members of LPEMS regardless of certification level are required to always maintain CPR/BCLS (Healthcare Provider) and current BBP certificate to remain operationally active in addition to the below requirements/suggestions.
